# Women's Center in Titusville

Things in Titusville continue to progress on a variety of levels. In the area of victim services, we continue to see monthly growth in the number of clients served. To help address that need we have been able to add a DV support group and limited counseling services with the help of Tammy Caligiuri, (registered mental health intern). Parrish Medical Center has once again stepped up to provide a room at the hospital for the support group to meet weekly, and the counselor as needed.

The Shelter continues to move forward as well. By the time this article goes to print, we will have our plans approved by the City of Titusville and, according to the terms of the funding grant, we will be soliciting bids for the project. We are on pace to complete the project on or before September 2011 and will have the shelter open and staffed by the Fall of 2011. Additionally, we have been given a small house in Titusville that we hope to clean up and sell to assist in funding the Titusville project.

We are also excited to announce the formation of our North Brevard Guild. Through a series of ongoing home group meetings, called Vision for Victims meetings, we have identified a core group of people who have become the foundation of our new guild. While the administrative structure of the group is in the works, they have set a goal of 201 members by the end of 2011 and to raise \$50,000.00 through membership, major donations, and events. Their first fundraiser, Men Rock the Runway, was an exciting kickoff event for our new guild.

## Counseling Services

The Women's Center offers counseling services for women and men, children, adolescents, couples, and families. We offer sliding scale fees for low cost counseling, and we accept insurance assignment for several insurance groups. Evening hours and Saturday hours are available upon request.

The Women's Center also offers free support groups for female survivors of domestic violence and for female survivors childhood sexual abuse; for male survivors of childhood abuse; and for children ages 6-12 who have been exposed to or victims of domestic violence.

## Career Guidance Program Highlights

The Women's Center Career Guidance program is a personalized program that explores career options and individual growth. Those who participate are able to have a clearer understanding of who they are, what motivates them, the skills they want to use in their work, and the education or specialized training that may be required. Under a grant from the Agency for Workforce Innovation we are able to assist displaced homemakers 35 years of age or older, who need training and support to transition to either their first job or back into the workforce.

## Transitional Housing Program

The Transitional Housing Program is a comprehensive, long-term program for homeless women and their children. This program provides counseling, case management and career guidance to clients while they are learning the life skills necessary for self sufficiency. This intensive program provides individualized support and services to women while they set and achieve their personal and professional goals. Clients also learn to effectively budget and save money so they are equipped to live independently when they leave our program.

## **Victim Services Program, two locations: Melbourne and Titusville**

The goal of our Victim Services program is to prevent domestic and sexual violence through education and information. Advocates will meet one on one with victims to develop a personalized safety plan, discuss their rights, and explore the dynamics of violence and their situation. Advocates may also assist clients through the injunction for protection process if this is an appropriate choice. Advocates assist by providing guidance when filing and support during the hearing. Our program is available to all victims of domestic violence, sexual violence, dating violence, and stalking. Advocates also can assist with the application for the state crime victims compensation program to assist with medical bills, mental health counseling and for lost wages as a result of the crime.

Our Victim Services Program offers domestic violence support groups (in English and Spanish), an incest survivors group, a men's survivor group, and a group for children who witness violence. In addition to staff and volunteer victim's advocates in both Melbourne and Titusville, the Victim Services Program includes a Violence Prevention Educator who conducts community outreach to our schools and community groups, a domestic violence consultant to assist other community agencies, and a full time victim's therapist.

We recently said goodbye to our long time advocate Glori Borges and wish her well. We welcome Jacqueline Ares in Melbourne and Candace Tate in Titusville as our full time staff victim advocates. And as always we want give thanks to all our volunteer advocates who assist countless people through difficult situations in person at the center, on the phones, or in our courthouses.

### **Client Services**

The Client Services program provides services and support for women and their families. # Women's Center Awards Second Microloan to Buoylift™ Designs

The Women's Center has awarded its second \$2,500 microloan to Yvonne Silverman, President of Buoy Clothing. Buoy Clothing was founded on a patent pending idea called the Buoy-Lift. This is a unique clothing design that adjustably lifts and supports a woman's breasts without underwire or shelf bras. Yvonne felt uncomfortable in nightgowns that offered no support and realized that many of her girlfriends had the same problem. The buoy-lift design has been prototyped, manufactured, market tested and sold to over two hundred women so far. The target audience is for women aged 30 to 65 years of age. The buoy-lift is a unique product and there are no major competitors at this time.

The \$2,500 loan will help Yvonne achieve several milestones in the growth of the company. A majority of the funding will be used to manufacture products in their Melbourne factory. The remaining will be used on advertising and website development to broaden the presence of Buoy Clothing across the country. They will also be using free or low cost networking as well as electronic and print media to establish the Buoy clothing brand.
